

Winfried Stelzer, The diplomas of Karlmann and Henry IV for Kremsmünster. Their earliest transmission on fragments of two cartularies (?) from the 12th century (p. 317–340)

This study analyses the hitherto unnoticed transmission of D. Km. 11 and 19 as well as D. H. IV. 463 on fragments from the 12th century. One of them, consisting of two small parchment strips, seems to be the remainder of the *antiquum registrum*, which was still intact around 1300 but is lost now. The apparently undisputable dating of the Codex Fridericianus, the most important manuscript transmitting the earlier charters of Kremsmünster, as 1302 is cast in doubt. As an appendix, D. H. IV. 463 is re-edited and an interpolation in its text is identified.
