

Walter Aspernig, Two newly found charters of duke Frederick II of Austria for Gundaker (III) of Starhemberg (p. 429–436)

Two charters in favour of the Austrian nobleman Gundaker (III) of Starhemberg prove that he, together with the witnesses of these acts, firmly remained loyal to Frederick II, duke of Austria, during the years of crisis in 1236–1239. In 1236 the duke gave rents and tithes in the *Riedmark* region to Gundaker, in 1240 he confirmed his exemption from the payment of tolls for food transports for his own use. The originals of both charters are lost, but German translations of the second one are known. Two recently found copies from the 17th century, however, preserve the Latin texts, and are edited here as an addition to the *Urkundenbuch zur Geschichte der Babenberger*.
